## STATE NURSING WORKFORCE EXPERTS

The national expert network includes:

- 46+ state nursing workforce organizations representing their state
- 10+ associate organizations
- Over 300 experts across the U.S.

## ORGANIZATION STATUS

State representative nursing organizations are in different phases of their lifecycle. Characterized as one of the Social Impact Lifecycle stages:

- 18% are Startup or Emerging
- 41% are growing
- 32% are maturing
- 9% are declining or in-crisis

## ORGANIZATION FUNDING

The majority of organizations has a median annual funding over \$100,000 with almost  $\frac{1}{3}$  over \$1,000,000.
